All 4-H Members and Volunteers need to log into 4-H Online v2.4honline.com. Each year, you will complete the health form information, code of conduct, publicity release, and evaluation release.

If you do not approve the publicity release, we will not be able to use photos or even list the name of the member in the 4-H Newsletter, Facebook, or other printed material.

Returning members and volunteers need to complete all of the steps by December 1. New members have until May 1 to enroll. New leaders will need to enroll and complete the background check before they can start working with members.

Check Your Club Bylaws

According to 4-H Policy, "All clubs are to function formally through a constitution and bylaws. These are the organizing documents of a club and describe how the club operates. A current copy of the club Constitution and Bylaws must be kept on file in the local extension office.

A template for clubs to use is on the Club Resources webpage: https://www.kansas4-h.org/4-h-programs/clubs/strengthening-clubs-2/docs/club-constitution-bylaws.pdf."

One of the options included in this template is to define a club quorum. The suggested wording is a "majority of members present for the regular meeting". This option could help clubs that struggle with attendance at regular club meetings.

Kansas 4-H has 9 Achievement levels. The levels increase in requirements. Some levels take members 2 or 3 years to earn.







Record Book are coming in January

Record Books with all of your project report forms will be returned to you at your January Club Meeting. The forms are not changing from last year. If you used Z-Books, you can start with your goals now.

But the more pressing issue right now could be project selection. Kansas 4-H has released a new project selection guide. It is attached to the end of this newsletter. Consider adding a new project or think about if it is time to start helping plan project meetings for a project you have done for 3-5 years. Talk to your club leaders about helping a project leader or talk to the county-wide project leader, if we have one.

Please keep in mind that 25% of the 4-H year is over before you get your project record forms. This means you need to be making notes in a notebook or on a calendar to add to your forms later.

As you make plans for your January Meeting, maybe you can plan some time to go through all of the forms in the record books. If families have lost their books, we sell the covers at the office (the first one is provided at no charge). We will also provide extra copies of permanent record forms if they are needed.

The bottom line, get a jump start now to make August and September easier when finishing up and applying for awards.

Scholarships are due March 1st, 2023 by 11:59PM CST.

For the sake of clarity in the following information, there will be two types of scholarships referenced; State 4-H Scholarships and the Vanier Family Scholarship Program (VFSP).

Eligibility

The new scholarship process has combined the State 4-H Scholarships and the Vanier Family Scholarship Program (VFSP) applications together. We hope that this encourages more applicants to pursue both of these scholarship opportunities. Please review the chart on the webpage to see which scholarships you are eligible for.

What You Will Need to Apply:

Application

Part 1: Select the scholarship program(s) that you are applying for (State 4-H Scholarships and/or the Vanier Family Scholarship Program.

Part 2: Answer questions regarding demographics, general 4-H participation, and academic information.

Part 3: Attach your Cover Letter and Resume (in a PDF). Please reference the Cover Letter and Resume handouts for additional information.

Part 4: Submit!

References

You need two references for your application to be considered complete. When identifying references, select individuals who can speak to the leadership, dedication, and commitment you have demonstrated. You should NOT use family members as a reference. There are no requirements and/or restrictions for how you should know your references.

References will NOT submit a letter of recommendation. References will be asked specific questions.


